1. PURPOSE

The Kwazulu-Natal Growth Fund Trust (KGFT) invites quotations from suitably qualified service providers to provide KGFT with 1 x Temporary resources (Chief Technology Officer (CTO)).

2. BACKGROUND

KZN Growth Fund Trust (KGFT) is a Trust, established and capitalised by the Provincial Government to provide debt and equity. The main objective of the KGFT is to provide support for creating and enabling environment for activities that create jobs and accelerate the economic development of KZN whilst promoting Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE).

2.1 Procurement Philosophy

It is the policy of KGFT, when purchasing goods and obtaining services to follow a course of optimum value and efficiency by adopting best purchasing practices in supply chain management, ensuring that open and fair competition has prevailed, with due regard being given to the importance of:

- a) The promotion, development and support of businesses from disadvantaged communities (small, medium, micro enterprises, as well as established businesses within those communities) in terms of its BEE Policy;
- b) The promotion of national and regional local service providers and agents before considering overseas service providers and;
- c) The development, promotion and support for the moral values that underpin the above, in terms of KGFT Business Ethics and Guidelines which requires that all commercial conduct be based on ethical and moral values and sound business practice. This value system governs all commercial behaviour within KGFT.

The KGFT wishes to engage with service providers who are equally committed to maintain high quality services and better pricing.

3. SCOPE OF SERVICES REQUIRED

Kwazulu-Natal Growth Fund Trust (KGFT) is looking for a highly skilled consulting Chief Technology Officer (CTO) with a storied history in the technological sector. He will be tasked with making executive technology decisions on behalf of the company, including managing a technology budget and making investments to align the company with its vision for its technological needs. You should be a strategic thinker, an effective communicator, and an expert in technological development. You will work directly under the CEO and will act as both a technology and business expert, making decisions that will impact the current and future operations of the company.

3.1 OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT/ACQUISITION

The aim of the CTO service is to select a service provider that would enable the following objectives:

- Business Analyst to work as a liaison amongst stakeholders to elicit, analyse, communicate, and
 validate requirements for changes to business processes and information systems, and to serve as
 conduit between the customer community and the software development / technology and support
 teams.
- The Enterprise Architect builds a holistic view of the organisation's strategy, processes, information, and information technology assets, ensuring that the business and ICT are in alignment, and links the business mission, strategy and processes of an organisation to its ICT strategy.
- Services will be provided for minimum of six (6) months to a year.
- KZN Growth Fund reserves the writes to extend or terminate services within reason.

The successful service provider will supply KZN Growth Fund with a resource(s) that are skilled and have experience in delivering the services as stipulated.

3.2 CTO Responsibilities:

- Setting a vision for how technology will be used in the company.
- Ensuring that technological resources meet the company's short and long-term needs.
- Creating timelines for the development and deployment of all technological services.
- Making executive decisions on behalf of the company's technological requirements.
- Maintaining a consumer-focused outlook and aiding in the delivery of IT projects to market.
- Managing technology budgets and time frames.
- Staying on top of technology trends and developments.
- Ensuring all technology practices adhere to regulatory standards and governance.
- Managing ICT contracts and ensuring value for money.
- Identify what technologies can be used to improve the company's products and services.
- Overseeing the effectiveness of technology resources within an organization like cloud services or on-premises services.

3.3 Competency and Experience:

- A degree in IT or computer science or related field.
- MBA preferred.
- 8 years working in a technological role.
- Years of managerial experience.
- Advanced technological skillset and a demonstrated history with technology.
- Exceptional team management skills.
- Excellent verbal and written communication.
- Ability to delegate efficiently.
- Extensive industry knowledge with an eye toward the future.

3.4 CHARACTERISTICS OF THE BIDDERS

- ICT experts with thought-provoking analysis capabilities, expertise with adjacent sectors, and strong external connections/networks
- Deep facilitation experience and creative processes that allow for robust dialogue, conversations that delve deeper than surface level, allowing for uncomfortable conversations, and driving towards clear decisions; and
- Bold thinkers are comfortable challenging the status quo and the received wisdom, willing to go out
 on a limb and provide us with recommendations on how we might adapt.

4. CONTRACT DURATION

The contract period is for six (6) months.

5. AWARD OF THE RFP

KGFT is not obliged to accept and award this tender to the lowest bidder or any other bidder.

6.1 STAGE 1 - COMPLIANCE WITH MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

All bids duly lodged as specified in this RFP will be examined to determine compliance with the minimum requirements and conditions. Failure to submit minimum requirements documents will disqualify the service provider from proceeding to the next evaluation stage.

6.2 FUNCTIONALITY EVALUATION

Scores will be tabulated to 100 points. Respondents must score 70 points and over to be assessed on their financial offer and preference score.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
 - (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10
 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used
 to determine the applicable preference point system; or
 - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,

then the organ of state must indicate the points allocated for specific goals for both the 90/10 and 80/20 preference point system.

 - (d) recommend that the tenderer or contractor, its shareholders and directors, or only the shareholders and directors who acted on a fraudulent basis, be restricted from obtaining business from any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years, after the audi alteram partem (hear the other side) rule has been applied; and
 - (e) forward the matter for criminal prosecution, if deemed necessary.
